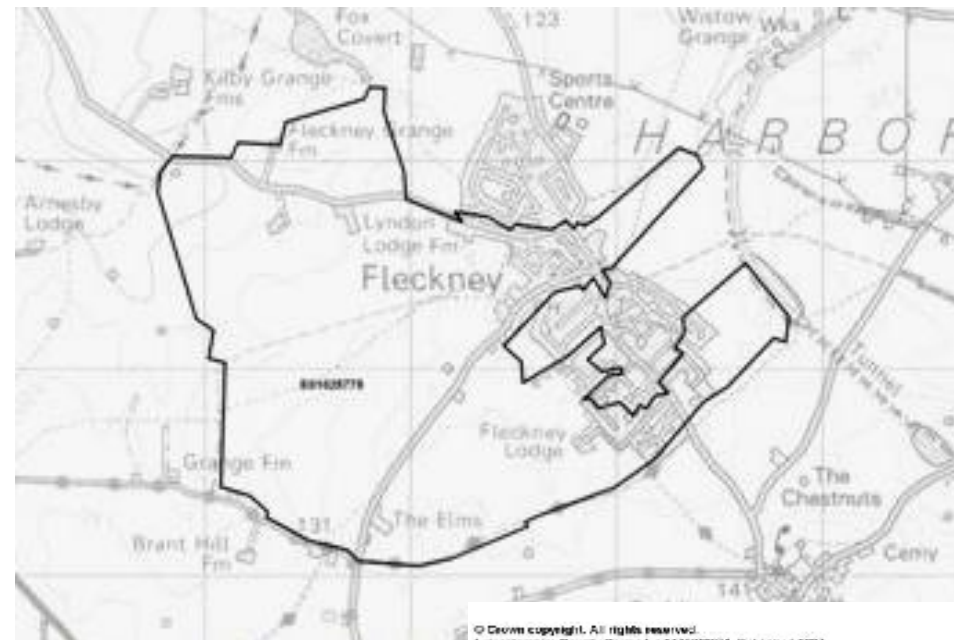
Fleckney

From the results of the survey, Fleckney is comparable with the average of all other areas surveyed in terms of people feeling they belong to their neighbourhood and that their neighbourhood is a good place to live.

Less people in Fleckney said they had spoken to someone outside their household (not including work) on the phone or by visiting, than the average of the other areas surveyed. The number of people who said they are happy living with people of different lifestyles was comparable with the rest.

In Fleckney, volunteering and giving unpaid help to someone in the last year was also comparable with the other areas surveyed. Fewer people in Fleckney had contacted a local counsellor, or MP in the last year compared with the average for other areas surveyed. Also fewer had attended a public meeting or neighbourhood forum to discuss local issues or had helped organise a petition on a local issue.

In Fleckney fewer people than average voted in General and District Council Elections than the average of other areas surveyed in Leicestershire.

What you said...

We asked people whether they agree or tended to agree that their neighbourhood is a place where people from different backgrounds get on together.

In Fleckney the result was 56%.

This compares with 58% in all areas surveyed in Leicestershire and, from a separate survey around a year ago, a figure of 78% for the East Midlands and 80% for England & Wales.

We asked whether many of the people in their neighbourhood can be trusted.

In Fleckney the result was 47%.

This compares with 43% for all the areas surveyed in Leicestershire and, from a separate survey around a year ago, a figure of 52% for the East Midlands and 49% for England & Wales.

We asked if in the last 12 months people had given unpaid help to groups, clubs or organisations for more than 2 hours a week.

In Fleckney the result was 14%.

For all areas surveyed in Leicestershire the corresponding figure was 14%.

We asked if in the last 12 months people had given unpaid help to friends, neighbours or anyone except relatives.

In Fleckney the result was 81%.
For all Leicestershire the corresponding figure was 77%.

In the survey we asked people whether they are satisfied with the overall delivery of public services.

In Fleckney 62% of those surveyed were satisfied or very satisfied.

This compares with 71% for all areas surveyed in Leicestershire.

We asked if people voted in the last Parish Council elections.

In Fleckney 32% of people voted in the last Parish Council Elections.

In Leicestershire this figure was found to be 36%.

We asked people if they feel they can influence decisions that affect their area on their own.

In Fleckney 13% of people agreed or definitely agreed.

In Leicestershire this figure was found to be 16%.

We also asked people if they feel they can influence decisions that affect their area when working with others in the neighbourhood.

In Fleckney 62% of people agreed or definitely agreed.

In Leicestershire this figure was found to be 62%.
